RECOGNIZES AND RESPECTS KEOKI FUKUMITSU FOR HIS DECADES OF WORK AS A KALO FARMER AND HIS CONTINUED ADVOCACY FOR FOOD SOVEREIGNTY AND SUSTAINABILITY THROUGH KALO FARMING IN WAIKĀNE, WINDWARD O'AHU, AND THROUGHOUT THE PAE 'ĀINA

Whereas, Keoki Fukumitsu (Uncle Keoki) is a seventh generation kalo farmer 1 2 who grew up in the lo'i and has been a taro farmer for many years; and 3 Whereas, Uncle Keoki learned to farm kalo from his 'ohana, as well as from a 4 number of renowned kalo farmers from across Hawai'i nei; and 5 Whereas, He continues to grow kalo on his family's kuleana lands in Hakipu'u; and 6 Whereas, Over the years Uncle Keoki has hosted thousands of people, including 7 many school children, at his lo'i in Hakipu'u through his close association with Queen 8 Liliu'okalani Children's Center, Alu Like, Kamehameha Schools, UH Mānoa, and 9 various colleges throughout Hawai'i; and 10 Whereas, He worked closely with Raymond Kane on Waiahole/Waikane lands that were condemned by the government because of military live fire training from World 11 War II to the 1960s that left unexploded ordnance throughout the valleys; and 12 Whereas, A heiau now sits on a ridge overlooking Waikāne Taro Flats called 13 14 Kahukukala, named after Raymond Kane's grandfather; and 15 Whereas, Mauka areas are now used by dirt bikers and pig hunters; and 16 Whereas, Uncle Keoki has, in the last two years, begun a major project to reopen the Waikāne Taro Flats, on the makai portions of the valley, with support from 17 community volunteers, as a way to continue a cultural and ancestral legacy handed down 18 to him from those who came before, and to encourage food sovereignty and sustainability 19 20 actions for the Windward O'ahu community and beyond; now, therefore, be it 21 Resolved, That Ka 'Ahahui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina (Hawaiian Patriotic League) at 22 its Annual Convention held in Lāhaina, Maui, this 11th day of March 2023, recognizes and respects Keoki Fukumitsu for his decades of work as a kalo farmer and for his 23 24 continued advocacy for food sovereignty and sustainability through kalo farming in 25 Waikāne, Windward O'ahu, and throughout the Pae 'Āina; and Resolved, That a certified copy of this resolution be distributed to all branches of 26 Ka 'Ahahui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina /Hawaiian Patriotic League, as well as to the Fukumitsu 27 extended 'ohana. 28

ACKNOWLEDGES THE GLOBAL TRIPARTITE SCOURGE OF IMPERIALISM, COLONIALISM, AND CAPITALISM UPON THE WORLD AND DECLARES ITSELF TO BE STEADFASTLY AND INHERENTLY ANTI-IMPERIALIST, ANTI-CAPITALIST AND DECOLONIAL IN NATURE

Whereas, Kānaka Maoli have been disaffected by colonialism from our first contact with the West in 1778 and the arrival of Captain James Cook;

Whereas, missionaries in the Hawaiian Kingdom preached conversion as a means of Kānaka Maoli to be saved from themselves and the purported sins of cultural traditions, and that these missionary efforts were part of a larger global colonial effort to subdue native peoples and take their lands;

Whereas, the property interests of the capitalist class in Hawai'i were the center of all political struggle to maintain sovereignty and independence as a state, to maintain our status as a neutral state, and to maintain humane working conditions of laborers;

Whereas the interests of capitalists residing within the Hawaiian Kingdom, in concert with US imperialist ambitions and economic interests grounded events around which the majority of political struggle in the 19th century were centered, including the Reciprocity Treaty of 1875, Bayonet Constitution of 1887, Overthrow of 1893 and so-called "Annexation" of 1898 and subsequent attempts at denationalization of Hawaiian Kingdom subject citizens, all of which being actions that served the interests of American imperialism;

Whereas, neocolonialism has become an established tactic of current and former colonial and imperial powers in maintaining economic and political dominance over newly independent former colonies in Africa, Asia, the Middle East, Oceania, and the rest of the colonized world;

Whereas, Hawaiian political and economic independence cannot take place without the return of Hawaiian land and waters; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That Ka 'Ahahui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina (Hawaiian Patriotic League) at its Annual Convention held at Nā Aikāne Cultural Center in Lāhaina, Maui, this 12th day of March 2023, Ka 'Ahahui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina acknowledges the global tripartite scourge of imperialism, colonialism and capitalism upon the world and declares itself to be steadfastly and inherently anti-imperialist, anti-capitalist and decolonial in nature;

AMENDS ARTICLE XI OF KAHAA BYLAWS RELATED TO CHARTERING NEW BRANCHES

Whereas, the steady and thoughtful growth of the Organization is important to its object to "prepare for the rise of the Hawaiian Kingdom" and to "defend and preserve our lands forever.";

Whereas, inter-branch cohesion, while not always possible, should be strived toward as a principle of unity and building power toward the objects of the Organization;

Whereas, the responsibilities of a new branch, as defined in Article XI of the KAHAA by-laws, are substantial;

Whereas, prior engagement and experience in a KAHAA branch prepares members to execute the responsibilities of a new branch as defined in Article XI of the KAHAA by-laws; and

Whereas, the establishment of a new branch by brand new members, by members who have no experience in KAHAA, by members who have shown no prior commitment to KAHAA outside of dues, do not facilitate inter-chapter cohesion, and can pose security threats to the Organization, therefore, be it

Resolved, That Ka 'Ahahui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina (Hawaiian Patriotic League) at its Annual Convention held at Lāhaina, Maui, this 11th day of March, 2023, revise Article XI, Section 1.C to read "Membership must consist of a minimum of 10 persons, with a majority being descendants of Hawaiian subjects, aboriginal or non-aboriginal, alive prior to January 17, 1893, and with either at least three of that majority having been an active member of an established branch for one year, or with a minimum of 1 year's mentorship as an organized group with an established branch; Resolved, That Article XI, Section 2 of the KAHAA by-laws are revised to read, "Whenever ten (10) or more persons, with a majority being descendants of Hawaiian subjects, aboriginal or non-aboriginal, alive prior to January 17, 1893, and with either at least three of that majority having been an active member of an established branch for one year, or with a minimum of 1 year's mentorship as an organized group of an established branch, desire to form a Branch of the League, they shall file a petition with the Central Body."

Resolved, That the word "active" is defined as having attending the majority of general membership meetings, or, having attended or supported a substantial number of branch activities, or having contributed substantially to committee work, as affirmed to the Central Body by the established branches members; and

Resolved, That formerly established branches who became inactive or were merged into another branch as a response to the COVID-19 pandemic challenges (Hilo, Waimea, Puna) are exempt from this added language so long as at least two members of said branches are among the 10 members to re-establish it;

Resolved, That a new branch shall be mentored by an existing branch for no shorter than one year;

40 *Resolved,* That a certified copy of this resolution be transmitted to all branches 41 of the League.

1	Whereas, both the overthrow and the belligerent occupation of the Hawaiian
2	Kingdom is motivated by profit-making;
3	Whereas, throughout the 19th century, our ancestors understood and wrote
4	about the threat of capitalist interests to our national sovereignty;
5	Whereas, alienation of Hawaiian national lands following the 1893 overthrow
4 5 6 7	was motivated by profit-making;
	Whereas, other nations and countries who have achieved decolonization or
8	de-occupation show us that the de-occupation of Hawai'i alone will not free us from
9	the bondage of the economic system we live in;
10	Whereas, the displacement of Kānaka Maoli today and for the past 130 years
11	can be traced to the desire of developers to profit off of lands upon which Kānaka
12	Maoli live, or the desire of the US military to use Hawaiian lands as staging and
13	training grounds to protect American business interests abroad;
14	Whereas, the inability of Kānaka Maoli to afford to live in Hawai'i, own a
15	home, afford life necessities, have good healthcare, or have access to healthy food is
16	rooted in an economy based on profit-making;
17	Whereas, the theft of Hawaiian lands and waters and our struggles to get them
18	back are a struggle against a capitalist class, a group of people who are most coherent
19	as a group by way of their capitalist beliefs, practices, and organization;
20	Whereas, the settler State of Hawai'i was established for, protects the interests
21	of, and is structured to support capitalism and a capitalist class, which Kānaka Maoli
22	primarily struggle against;
23	Whereas, there is a growing movement to further erode protections to 'āina,
24	workers, and Kānaka interests (deregulation), to shift from public funding for things
25	like public education, healthcare and housing, which a large number of Kānaka Maoli
26	depend on (austerity), and to only consider solutions to our generations biggest
27	problems such as climate change, housing, food security, and clean water, through
28	profit-driven solutions;
29	Whereas, the economic system that is grounded in profit-making over all else,
30	including the health and well-being of 'āina, wai, kanaka, and even the sovereignty of
31	nations is called Capitalism;
32	Whereas, Capitalism, is the most fundamental threat to Aloha 'Āina;
33	Whereas, to build strategy against, effectively fight, and ultimately overcome

 Whereas, The United States military continues to conduct the largest maritime exercise in the world in the Pacific Ocean biennially, in an area expanding across the Pacific from the U.S. West Coast to the northernmost reaches of the Papahanaumokuakea Marine National Monument;

Whereas, At minimum twenty-six nations and 25,000 military personnel on this planet are invited to participate along with the U.S. Armed Forces under the pretense of national security for the so called Indo-Pacific as an occupying force to justify and legitimize its actions

Whereas, Hawai'i and Moana Nui are being used as a proving ground for the military to test new weapons, engage in amphibious assaults of our shorelines, and conduct live firebombing into conservation zones and artillery shelling of Pōhakuloa causing devastating consequences on the environment on Mauna Kea, sink-ex exercises that involve the use of missiles to sink decommissioned battleships, the use of smart bombs, chemical weapons and sonar activities that cause irreversible harm to marine life, causing mass whale strandings;

Whereas, The military continues to be considered exempt from regulation or independent observation or assessment across the Pacific by those most impacted while the exercises are occurring;

Whereas, Gendered violence and sex trafficking increases in the Hawaiian islands each year the RIMPAC or any of its participating members who are in Hawai'i:

Whereas, The US Navy Indo-Pacific Command who is in charge of the RIMPAC exercises, has leaked jet fuel into O'ahu's fresh water supply lines and released the fire retardant known as AFFF, which contains "forever chemicals" known as PFAS which cause cancer and other serious illness, into our soils from the Red Hill Bulk Storage facility and are not stewards of our land or waters;

Whereas, As stated in the 2019 Ka 'Ahahui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina Resolution on RIMPAC, The Hawaiian Kingdom continues to exists as a neutral nation under occupation;

Whereas, There continues to "be no disclosure of the types-nor numbers-of missiles, projectiles, bombs or ammunition to be expended, which include the use of depleted uranium and other harmful contaminants and toxic materials";

Whereas, "The arbitrary use of this segment of the Pacific Ocean is indicative of the United States claim of domination over such sea, air and subsurface resources";

Whereas, There have been 28 such exercises, without the consent of the Hawaiian Kingdom and without consultation of Kanaka Maoli communities most directly impacted, without any challenge from the state and under the delusion that this type of massive environmental destruction in the midst of climate change benefits the economy;

Whereas, Hui Aloha 'Āina o ka Malu 'Ulu o Lele (HAA Lahaina), a branch of the Hawaiian Patriotic League, works in parallel with Nā 'Aikāne o Maui, Inc., a designated repository for Iwi Kūpuna discovered in Lāhainā, in order to fulfill an objective codified in HAA Lahaina's Bylaws: "To mālama i nā kūpuna hiamoe loa, including assisting in the repatriation of iwi kūpuna, and protection and restoration of ancient burial sites, not limited to 'āina and kai";

Whereas, Hui Aloha 'Āina o ka Malu 'Ulu o Lele advocates that Iwi Kūpuna be reinterred in place, or within the Moku in which they were discovered at the earliest possible time;

Whereas, The United States' (U.S.) occupational government practices jurisdiction over Hawaiian Iwi illegally, and has caused injury to Iwi Kūpuna and lineal descendants;

Whereas, the U.S. occupational government's State of Hawai'i has not designated repositories and reinterment sites within each Moku causing Iwi Kūpuna to be removed, held, and reinterred far from the sites at which they were first discovered;

Whereas, the U.S. occupational government's Burial Councils, agents created by the State of Hawaii's Historic Preservation Division to "determine preservation or relocation of previously identified Native Hawaiian burial sites", are dysfunctional in that the Councils:

- 1. Routinely cancel regular meetings, or are chronically unable to make quorum thus:
 - a. severely limiting the ability of descendants to bring grievances or to make claims; and
 - b. delaying decision-making on appropriate management, treatment, and protection of burial sites; and

FULLY SUPPORTS AHEC 2022 33rd GENERAL SYNOD'S EFFORTS TO END 128 YEARS OF WAR BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND THE HAWAIIAN KINGDOM

 Whereas, On July 17, 2022, at the Thirty-Third General Synod from the UCC's Association of Hawaiian Evangelical Churches (AHEC), a resolution was passed to end 128 Years of War Between the United States of America and the Hawaiian Kingdom that called on church leaders and the U.S. to recognize its own presence in the Hawaiian islands as an "illegal occupation" according to international law. AHEC is made up of 31 historically Native Hawaiian congregations from across Hawaii. Some 80 percent of them were founded before 1893, the year the United States took Hawaii by military overthrow; (See appendix attached).

Whereas, Henry Opukahaia is known as the missionary from the Hawaiian Kingdom that encouraged American missionaries to arrive in Hawaii; [i], [ii]

Whereas, the first Christian nation in the Pacific, the Hawaiian Kingdom Constitution in 1840 began with a quote from the bible "God hath made of one blood all nations of men, to dwell on the face of the earth in unity and blessedness"; [iii], [iv], [v]

Whereas, on December 19, 1842, United States President John Tyler agreed to recognize the independence of the Hawaiian Kingdom; [vi]

Whereas, the Christian Hawaiian Kingdom through treaties with friendly nations around the world, successfully modernized Hawaiian self-governance at the time to prosper in peace, trade and friendship through treaties with friendly nations around the world for fifty years; [vii]

Whereas, Rev. Rufus Anderson, the author of the three-self method (self-supporting, self-governing and self-propagating) and the long-term secretary of the ABCFM (American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Mission) arrived in Hawai'i in 1863 to tell the missionaries to create self-reliant, self-governing churches and "to devolve upon it (the Hawaiian churches) the responsibilities of self-government in ecclesiastical matters"; [viii]

Whereas, Rev. Anderson's advice was not followed and the government of the Hawaiian Kingdom was overthrown on January 17, 1893; [ix]

Whereas, on December 18, 1893, President Grover Cleveland's executive agreement to restore the Christian Hawaiian Kingdom was signed by Liliuokalani and received by U.S. ambassador Albert Willis; [x]

Whereas, in 1991, the Eighteenth General Synod of the United Church of Christ directed President Paul Sherry to issue an apology on the 100th anniversary of the overthrow of the Hawaiian monarchy for the complicity of the church in the overthrow; [xi], [xii]

Whereas, in 1993 President Clinton, with senators and representatives from Hawaii, signed Public law 103-150 apologizing for the United States role in the illegal occupation; [xiii]

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Whereas, the National Lawyers Guild recommended to the Governor of the State of Hawaii "to begin to comply with international humanitarian law in its prolonged and illegal occupation of the Hawaiian Islands"; [xiv]

Whereas, the United Church of Christ has historically stressed the importance of Justice as a key faith component for the Church;

Whereas, the correction of injustices depends upon correct history based upon factual matters, and history is often based upon who writes the history and factual information available;

Whereas, the information included in this resolution will be available at https://ahecchurch.weebly.com/ about the founding of the Hawaiian Kingdom to correct false history about the Christian Hawaiian Kingdom;

Whereas, various General Synods of the United Church of Christ have taken proactive stands on Justice;

Whereas, justice depends upon action, not just stating what is true and just and right (pono in Hawaiian);

Whereas, the United Church of Christ has stated a historical commitment to justice, and peace;

Whereas, the Hawaiian Kingdom has also historically been a friendly Christian nation whose constitution was founded upon Christian values and rooted in Aloha 'Āina;

Whereas, the Ka Hui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina (Hawaiian Patriotic League) was established in the aftermath of the overthrow of the Hawaiian Kingdom and Oueen Lili'uokalani on January 17, 1893, to promote Hawaiian patriotism and independence;

Whereas, the Ka Hui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina (Hawaiian Patriotic League) has a long history of opposing the illegal overthrow, fake annexation and illegal occupation of the Hawaiian Islands to the United States;

Whereas, the Ka Hui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina (Hawaiian Patriotic League) organized and collected the Kū'ē Petitions in 1897 to oppose annexation, which ultimately blocked a treaty of annexation in the United States Senate;

Whereas, the Ka Hui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina (Hawaiian Patriotic League) continues to work towards the restoration of Hawaiian sovereignty and self-determination;

Whereas, the ongoing conflict between the United States and the Hawaiian Kingdom has resulted in war crimes targeting and violating Hawaiian citizens in Hawaiian Kingdom territory and abroad, resulting in a colossal scale of humanitarian and human rights violations daily;

Whereas, the Baibala teaches that all humans are created equal and calls for justice and righteousness in our actions towards one another; and

Whereas, the overthrow of the Hawaiian Kingdom in 1893 was illegal and continues to impact the Hawaiian people to this day;

Resolved, That Ka 'Ahahui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina (Hawaiian Patriotic League) at its Annual Convention held in Lāhaina, Maui, this [day]th day of March 2023

Resolved, that the Association of Hawaiian Evangelical Churches and the Ka Hui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina (Hawaiian Patriotic League) fully support the resolution encouraging the end of 128 years of war between the United States of America and the Hawaiian Kingdom and call for an end to the ongoing conflict and the promotion of reconciliation and human rights for the Hawaiian people.

Resolved, that the Ka Hui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina (Hawaiian Patriotic League) will work together with the Association of Hawaiian Evangelical Churches to support any efforts to address the injustices committed against the Hawaiian Kingdom and its people.

Resolved, that Ka Hui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina (Hawaiian Patriotic League) in joining the Association of Hawaiian Evangelical Churches in call on the United States government to recognize the sovereignty of the Hawaiian Kingdom and to work towards a just and peaceful resolution of the ongoing conflict.

Resolved, that the Association of Hawaiian Evangelical Churches has stated a commitment to working towards a just and peaceful resolution of the ongoing conflict between the United States and the Hawaiian Kingdom, in accordance with the principles of the Bible and the teachings of Jesus; and

Whereas, Iranians living outside of Iran have been drawing attention to the humanitarian crisis and the bravery of everyday people in Iran resisting the violence of the dictatorship;

Whereas, Hundreds of thousands of people have taken part in Global Days of Action for Iran to show support and solidarity with the women and youth leadership who are risking their lives to put an end to the systemic subjugation of women and gender/ethnic minorities in Iran; and

Whereas, Standing in solidarity with the popular freedom movements of oppressed people seeking safety, dignity, and freedom in their homelands, wherever they are in the world, is mandated by those who espouse aloha, kuleana, pono, and all cultural concepts dear to us as kānaka 'ōiwi and as Hawaiian Kingdom subjects; now, therefore, be it

SEEKS DIRECTION FROM THE ACTING MINISTER OF THE INTERIOR, DR. DAVID KEANU SAI OF THE ACTING COUNCIL OF REGENCY, SPECIFICALLY REQUESTING A HAWAIIAN KINGDOM MANIFESTO

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1	Whereas, The monarchical government of the Hawaiian Islands was established
2	in 1810 by His Majesty King Kamehameha I; and
3	Whereas, His son, Kauikeaouli, King Kamehameha III, concerned about foreign
4	encroachment on Hawaiian territory, sought to negotiate treaties with the United States
5	and Europe to secure recognition of Hawaiian independence from the major world
6	powers; and
7	Whereas, On December 14, 1842, U.S. President Tyler recognized Hawaiian
8	independence; and
9	Whereas, The following year, 1843, Great Britain and France also recognized
10	the independence of the Hawaiian Kingdom; and
11	Whereas, As a result of the recognition of Hawaiian independence in 1843, the
12	Hawaiian Kingdom entered into treaties and conventions with multiple European
13	nations, former European colonies, and the United States; and
14	Whereas, Under the reign of Queen Lili'uokalani the Hawaiian Kingdom
15	government was illegally overthrown by traitors to the Hawaiian Kingdom government
16	with the aid of agents of the United States; and
17	Whereas, Because there was no lawful subsequent action to acquire the
18	Hawaiian Kingdom via treaty, the Hawaiian Kingdom continues to exist, as the legality
19	of that action cannot be proven; thus the Hawaiian Kingdom continues to be a country
20	under occupation by the United States military to this day; and
21	Whereas, Given the international law principle of "presumption of continuity" of
22	the Hawaiian State while under an illegal occupation, and the supremacy of its legal
23	order, a plan of action was determined to create an acting government and assume the
24	de facto role of the Council of Regency so that the legal order of the Hawaiian State
25	could be represented both domestically and internationally; and
26	Whereas, On September 10, 1999, it was determined by the Council of Regency
27	(under Article 33 of the 1864 Constitution) that the acting Minister of Interior should
28	resume the office of acting Minister of the Interior, and the entire Cabinet Council serve
29	as an acting Council of Regency within the meaning of Article 33 of the 1864
30	Constitution; and
31	Whereas, It was also agreed upon in Privy Council in the Council of Regency
32	that David Keanu Sai serve as Chairman of the acting Council, and

Whereas, The acting Council serves as the de facto organ of the Hawaiian State

under the legal doctrine of necessity and does not represent any particular group of

individuals organized by ethnic origin or by common ideology; and

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Whereas, The acting Council is limited and operates within the framework of Hawaiian domestic law, which is defined by the 1864 constitution and the statutes lawfully enacted by the Legislative Assembly previous to the illegal constitution in 1887; and

 Whereas, The acting Council has no effectiveness and has no direct link to the national population, pending the reconvening of the Legislative Assembly; and

Whereas, The acting Council is fundamentally tied to the doctrine of legal continuity of the Hawaiian State and the supremacy of its legal order as defined by its constitution and statutes; and

Whereas, Since 1999, the national population (the Lāhui) has continued to decline in health, economic stability, and long-term ability to protect lands and waters that have sustained them since time immemorial; and

Whereas, The Lāhui is and has been for the past 130 years in a state of instability, suffering historical and generational trauma as a result of actions taken by the United States at the time of and following the illegal overthrow of the Hawaiian Kingdom government; and

Whereas, The Lāhui has suffered consistent decline as a people and seeks the means to better resist illegal occupation, as well as direction on how to proceed in maintaining national and cultural continuity until such time as relief is provided; and

Whereas, While the Lāhui recognizes the inability of the acting Minister of Interior of the acting Council of Regents to act on behalf of the people because the Council of Regents has no direct link to the national population, there are no other legal avenues from which to seek direction for present day efforts to respond to over a century of illegal occupation; and

Whereas, The Lāhui seeks direction from the acting Minister of Interior, in consultation with the acting Council of Regents, to provide guidance for action and behavior consistent with what are historically and culturally appropriate responses to occupation, as no other entity presently exists that can speak to the needs of the national population in keeping with the legal right to rule as established under Article 33 of the 1864 constitution; and

Whereas, The L \bar{a} hui, at this time in history, has been without enlightened leadership for 130 years; and

Whereas, Members of the Lāhui, the national population, are bereft, dying, ill, mentally and physically suffering and seek immediate relief; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That Ka 'Ahahui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina (Hawaiian Patriotic League) at its Annual Convention held in Lāhaina, Maui, this 12th day of March 2023, seeks direction from the acting Minister of Interior, Dr. David Keanu Sai, representing the acting Council of Regency, specifically requesting a Hawaiian Kingdom Manifesto; and

Resolved, That this Manifesto will specifically address the guiding principles and beliefs that inform the actions (or non-actions) of the acting Council of Regency specific to the Lāhui in the following areas: health and wellness, return of 'āina, pono economic development, food security, climate change and disaster preparedness, and all matters of safety and well-being pertaining to the internal affairs of the Lāhui under occupation; and

30	Resolved, That this Manifesto is meant to be a guide to the Lahui, rather than a
31	long-term plan, but one that is meant to facilitate the eventual de-occupation of the
32	Hawaiian Kingdom; and
33	Resolved, That a certified copy of this resolution be transmitted to all branches
34	of Ka 'Ahahui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina/Hawaiian Patriotic League and Dr. David Keanu
35	Sai.
